


Principal's Message

Did you know that we have a **School Plan to Enhance Student Learning**? This plan references the District Strategic Plan and identifies goals aligned to literacy, numeracy, and social-emotional learning.

Due to the pandemic, we have noticed that the children's level of mastery in literacy and numeracy have been negatively impacted so we are adjusting our instructional plans to support students along the continuum of learning.

Here is a graph that shows the mastery level of number sense for students in grades 3 and 6. The "green" bar refers to the percentage of learners that are meeting expectations; the "yellow" bar refers to the percentage of learners that are *minimally* meeting expectations; and the "red" bar refers to the percentage of learners that are *not yet* meeting expectations.



Number sense is so important for elementary students to develop because it promotes flexible thinking. It allows children to create a relationship with numbers and be able to talk about math as a language. Unlike math drills, rich number sense activities develop problem-solving skills in real-life applications. To support your child's development of number sense, I encourage you to consider providing regular time for your child to log onto www.mathletics.com so they can practice building their number sense.
