

Principal's Message

March is upon us and all of the staff at Decker Lake are looking forward to spring and warmer temperatures. March is also a time of year that we send home report cards before spring break.

Although report card season can be stressful for students and families, it is a time to engage in conversation with students and families about student achievement and student progress, and also an opportunity to discuss these with teachers. It is an opportunity to:

Discuss the grades and comments with your child. Ask him/her:

- What is the grade they want?
- O What can you do to help them accomplish that?
- O Is there anything they need from the teacher to accomplish that?

Be sure to discuss the goal with your child's teacher; it takes a village to educate a child and the teacher will be able to support your child and provide feedback about the goal and progress that is made to achieving it. This also builds an important connection between the school and home about learning goals.

SPRING BREAK ACTIVITIES TO PROMOTE LITERACY AND NUMERACY:

- Watch a movie with your child and the family. Talk about:
 - the setting of the movie (where it takes place);
 - the characters:
 - describe interesting features about the characters- their costumes, their actions, their personalities;
 - Stop the movie half-way through and predict the ending;
 - Talk about your favourite part of the movie;
- O Take the time to bake together or prepare a meal together. Cooking or baking with your child gives you the opportunity to have a real-life way to work with fractions by doubling or tripling a recipe. Play a board game or a card game together. This encourages the development of social language, turn
- taking, and the development of numeracy and literacy skills.

Attendance matters! Every day of school missed is an opportunity to learn missed. It's also a day missed in building connections with peers and school staff. Studies have shown that absenteeism in Kindergarten leads to students struggling in grade 1 and beyond. Regular attendance at school promotes academic and social engagement in the school community, which positively impact student self esteem and academic growth.

Early Kindergarten and Grade 1 Registrations start March 13 to 17. We are looking forward to St. Patrick's Day and wearing green on March 17th. SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 91 (NECHAKO LAKES) PRE-REGISTRATION FOR KINDERGARTEN OR GRADE 1 AND OUT-OF-CATCHMENT APPLICATIONS

Pre-registration for children who will be entering Kindergarten or children who will be entering Grade 1 at a new SD91 school in September 2023 will take place

March 13 – 17, 2023, at the times listed below.

NOTE: Students who will be entering Grade 1 in September 2023 and who are presently enrolled in Kindergarten at the same school need NOT register.

Registration Requirements:

Kindergarten students must be five (5) years old by December 31, 2023.

Grade 1 students must be six (6) years old by December 31, 2023. Please bring the child's 'Care Card' or 'BC Services Card' and birth certificate. We

encourage immunization to be up to date prior to starting school. Inquiries regarding immunization can be made by contacting the Health Unit.

Out-of-Catchment Application Reminder:

Applications can be submitted starting March 13, 2023. Parents wishing to have their child (or children) attend a school out of their home catchment area must complete the Out-of-Catchment application form at the school they are hoping to attend next school

Applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis up to May 15, 2023. Parents & guardians should also register their students at their home school to ensure space, in the event that their Out-of-Catchment application is not approved.
