LAST DAY OF REGISTRATION <u>TOMORROW</u> FOR PRE-REGISTRATION FOR KINDERGARTEN OR GRADE 1 AND OUT-OF-CATCHMENT APPLICATIONS

Pre-registration for children entering Kindergarten or children entering Grade 1 at a <u>new SD91</u> school in September 2023 will take place <u>March 17, 2023</u>, at the times listed below.

NOTE: Students entering Grade 1 in September 2023 and who are presently enrolled in Kindergarten at the same school need **NOT** register.

<u>SCHOOL</u>	Pre-Registration Time
Decker Lake Elementary School	9:00 am – 12:00 pm & 1:00 pm – 2:00 pm

Registration Requirements:

Kindergarten students must be five (5) years old by December 31, 2023.

Grade 1 students must be six (6) years old by December 31, 2023.

Please bring the child's 'Care Card' or 'BC Services Card' and birth certificate. We encourage immunization to be up to date prior to starting school. Inquiries re-

garding immunization can be made by contacting the Health Unit.

Out-of-Catchment Application Reminder:

Applications can be submitted starting March 13, 2023. Parents wishing to have their child (or children) attend a school out of their home catchment area must complete the Out-of-Catchment application form at the school they hope to attend next school year. Applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis up to May 15, 2023. Parents & guardians should also register their students at their home school to ensure space, in the event that their Out-of-Catchment application is not approved.


