Irish Her- itage	nonth to celebrate the history and contributions of the Irish people in Canada.		
Month	According to the 2016 Canadian census, 13.4% of the population claimed partial or full Irish ancestry and approximately 4.6 million Canadians can trace their ancestry back to Ireland. From the very earliest Irish settlers in the 17th and 18th century to today, the Irish have been ever present in the Canadian landscape		
March 20 Nowruz	Iranian or Persian New Year. It begins on the spring equinox and marks the beginning of Farvardin, the first month of the Solar Hijri calendar Nowruz mean "New Day" The ceremonies surrounding Nowruz centre on community, family, and deep respect for tradition.		
	Preparations for Nowruz begin about three weeks prior with spring-cleaning, a cess called "Khoneh Takooni" which translates as "shaking of the house." In the weeks leading up to the actual day, families also set aside space for a "har seen (seven S) table" or a collection of seven items that symbolize a different ho for the New Year. The seven hopes are rebirth, love, health, beauty, patience, prosperity, and sunrise.		
March 21	International Day for the Elimination of Racial Discrimination A United Nations Day of remembrance and action. Observed annually on the day that 69 people lost their lives to the hands of the police in Sharpeville, South Africa, while demonstrating peacefully against apartheid "pass laws" in 1960.		
March 31	International Transgender Day of Visibility The day is dedicated to celebrating the accomplishments of transgender and gender nonconforming people while raising awareness of the work that still needs to be done to achieve trans justice.

Student Learning Survey 2024/2025

The Provincial Student Learning Survey is unique in its scope, size and usefulness to schools. It gathers information from parents/guardians/caregivers, teachers, and students on topics related to school environment, safety, and achievement. The information is used for planning in individual schools and provides a district and provincial perspective.

Early in **2025** the Student Learning Survey will be administered to students in grades 4 & 7, their parents/guardians/caregivers, and all school staff. We encourage parents/guardians/ caregivers to participate in this survey, as the results are important in identifying and celebrating current strengths, as well as determining where the school needs to focus improvement. The surveys contain standard questions for the Province – in addition, questions from the school and/or district that focus on local conditions or issues may be included.

The survey can be completed electronically and can be accessed on the Internet at https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/ education-training/k-12/support/student-learning-survey. Any computer or mobile device with an Internet connection can be used, and access to the e-survey is simple and secure. The survey can be accessed through the link and by clicking on Take the Survey. On the login page, click on the Parents icon, and then select the school district and school name where your child attends school. Provincial, District and School Reports for previous years can be viewed at the same site under the Results section.

The e-survey site will be open until May 2, 2025.






Attention Parents, Guardians & Caregivers!!!

Out-of-Catchment Application Reminders:

*** This process is not the same as school registration. ***

Applications can be submitted starting March 17, 2025. Parents wishing to have their child (or children) attend a school out of their home catchment area must complete the Out-of-Catchment application form at the school they are hoping to attend next school year. Applications will be accepted on a first come, first serve basis up to May 15, 2025. Parents & guardians should also register their students at their home school to ensure space, in the event that their Out-of-Catchment application is not

approved. *** Out-of-Catchment applications may be limited at some schools this year due to enrolment considerations. *
