Outline ways in which these goals can be met. By starting small, your child can experience the feeling of success that will ignite future acts of improvement.

Angela Duckworth, author of "Grit: The Power of Passion and Perseverance" writes that "A fixed mindset about ability leads to pessimistic explanations of adversity, and that, in turn, leads to both giving up on challenges and avoiding them in the first place. In contrast, a growth mindset leads to optimistic ways of explaining adversity, and that, in turn, leads to perseverance and seeking out new challenges that will ultimately make you even stronger." How we view learning and making mistakes shape our beliefs about intelligence and talent. We can improve our intelligence with effort as the brain is remarkably adaptive. Like a muscle that gets stronger with use, the brain changes itself when you struggle to master a new challenge. By carving aside time every day to practice reading, DLES students can improve their reading skills and become proficient readers.

### **Covid Reporting**

We are still living in COVID-19 times which means we still wash and sanitize our hands, and wear masks.

We want to sincerely thank the parents who have taken the time and courageous steps to inform us when their children have tested positive for COVID-19. Giving us this heads-up allows us to ensure our COVID-19 protocols are still strong and keeping all of us here at the school safe and healthy.

Did you know we have some steps to follow when parents call to let us know when their child is positive for COVID-19? The following is what we have to do.

- A parent calls to inform us know their child has tested positive (thank you so much for letting us know—we really appreciate this information! Did I say this already? It's true!!!).
- 2. We let Superintendent Mr. Madhok know your child's name, grade, teacher, and your child's last day of attendance.
- 3. Mr. Madhok contacts Northern Health to request contact tracing.
- 4. From there, it is up to Northern Health to complete the contact tracing and to determine if there is a school exposure.
- Until then, we are bound by the strict confidentiality policy that governs this situation. We CANNOT let other parents know unless Northern Health gives us the green light to do so.
- 6. If your child tests positive, please let Northern Health (NH) know the name of the school your child attends and that the school is available to answer any questions NH may have such as attendance, bus student or not, etc.
- 7. Lastly, if parents are unhappy about the process, please contact Northern Health and let them know.

These are challenging times but we'll get through so long as we all do our parts. "Be kind, keep calm, and stay safe."

For unvaccinated children under 12 returning to Canada, the following applies:

Children under 12 must complete <u>pre-entry</u>, <u>arrival and Day-8 tests</u> unless you have evidence your child had a positive COVID-19 test taken 14 to 180 days prior to arrival in Canada or your child is under 5 years of age.

For the next 14 days, the children must also:

Not attend school, camp or daycare; not attend large or crowded settings; not take busses; not attend a setting where they may have contact with vulnerable people; avoid all contact with persons with underlying medical conditions, compromised immune systems, and are 65 years or older; stay with their fully vaccinated parent or guardian as much as possible; and wear a mask.
