Soapberry ice cream is an Indigenous dessert made from soapberries (Shepherdia canadensis) that are whipped with water and a sweetener, such as sugar, to create a foamy, meringue-like consistency. The process uses the natural soap-like saponin found in the berries, which creates the frothy texture. The dish is a sweet and tangy treat with a unique taste, and it's traditionally consumed after feasts.


