

Principal's Message

The Parent Drop-Off Parking Zone, located at the base of the parking lot, has been a zone of confusion and periodic congestion. With feedback from parents at a fall PAC meeting, I'm pleased to share that the Facilities department will be working towards a solution.

The plan is to create a clear one-lane entry at the base of the lot. This one-lane will flow into 4 or more temporary drop-off lanes. All the lanes will be flowing in the same direction so all vehicles will be facing in the same direction and no one will be required to back-up. The drop-off lanes will be bordered by a student cross walk that will run parallel to the frontage road that leads into the school.

Students will be expected to exit the vehicle and use the cross walk to access the playground. This route may require a few extra steps by the students, but it will increase their visibility to other drivers.

These upgrades will take place through the application of painted lines with no major renovations needed. Perhaps the biggest obstacle we will face will be changing driver and student habits? Let's hope not.

Once the painted lines are completed, please do your best to follow the new direction of the drop-off circuit. By working together, we can ensure a safe drop-off and pick-up for our learners. Thank you in advance for your cooperation!




