

#### Principal's Message

Report cards went home last Friday, March 4, 2022. This is a time when parents/caregivers get an overall glimpse into how their child is doing in the current school year. Think of the report card as a window into the classroom. This isn't a view that you want to ignore – so please look in the window and take time to understand who your child is in the classroom and how you can best support them in their schooling.

One area of concern is poor student attendance. Research shows that missing 10 percent of the school year, or about 19 days, negatively affects a student's academic performance. While our school tracks daily student attendance, we wrestle with ways that we can help students improve their attendance rates. Sometimes we phone the family to see how they are doing, or we mail out the school newsletters so families can stay connected to the school. While these gestures hopefully show that we care about your child and miss them, they don't yield big gains in attendance rates. What can we do as a school to promote good attendance? In what ways can we support families of children with chronic absenteeism? These are questions that we wrestle with, and we wish we had all the answers because attendance matters. When students improve their attendance rates, they improve their academic prospects and chances for graduating.

While some students are not fans of report card time, the core purpose of report cards is to help students improve and grow. Please read over the comments your child's teacher has taken the time to write and make a special note of the attendance label at the top of the report card. Thank you for your on-going dedication to your child's success at school.
